

## How to Make A Spin Drum!



### Materials:

2 sturdy Paper Plates 6" or 7"  
2 or 4 Ribbons, 12" long  
4 Pony Beads or Buttons  
Markers or crayons  
Hole Punch or something to make holes  
Straw (optional)  
Stickers (optional)

1. First put one dot on each plate and tell your child this is the top so that if they do a drawing it is right side up.
2. Next punch the holes through both plates so they match up. One on each side (at 3:00 and 9:00). If you are using a straw punch two holes at the bottom (On either side of the 6:00 mark)



3. Have the kids use markers and stickers to create a design on each side of the plates. Have them fill it in! Use your imagination!
4. When finished, if you are using a straw, tape it strongly into place between the two holes on the bottom of the plate.
5. Place the plates together and tie a double knot with a piece of ribbon on each side of the plate. Tie it tight!
6. Tie beads or buttons to each one of the four ends.
7. Now tie ribbons through the two holes around the straw. Tie it tight!
8. Now twist the straw between your hands, or hold on to the bottom and twist the plates so the beads clack on the plates.
9. You are making music!

## How to Make A Tambourine!



### Materials:

1 or 2 sturdy Paper Plates any size  
1 pipe cleaner, cut into 4 3" segments.  
8 bells  
3 ribbons 12" long  
Hole Punch or something to make holes  
Stickers (optional)

1. First put one dot on each plate and tell your child this is the top so that if they do a drawing it is right side up.
2. Punch the holes putting both plates together. You can also use just one plate. Make the holes at (2:00, 4:00, 6:00, 8:00 and 10:00).
3. Have the kids use markers and stickers to create a design on each side of the plates. Have them fill the whole plate in! Use imagination!
4. Use a pipe cleaner segment and two bells at tie them in the 2:00, 4:00, 8:00 and 10:00 holes
5. In the bottom hole (6:00), tie the ribbons in a knot.
6. Start shaking your tambourine and make some music!
