

# TECHNIQUES IN WATERCOLOR

## Supply List

Instructor: Kene Lohman

- Strathmore Cold Press Watercolor Pad 11" x 15"—Other brands acceptable, but this takes watercolor the best.
- # 6 and # 8 Round Brush—Start with one of these sizes of round brushes until you are sure you want to pursue watercolor.
- 1" Flat Brush
- Hake Brush 2 1/2 "
- Art Pallet with wells – It is best to get a folding palette so your paint does not dry. Try Hobby Lobby for both.
- Paint colors  
(Student Grade is fine)
  - Thalo blue\*
  - Cadmium Yellow (Med or Light)\*
  - Alizarin Crimson\*
  - Paynes Gray\*
  - Ultramarine Blue
  - Vermilion
  - Burnt Sienna
  - Veridian
  - Yellow Ochre
  - Hookers Green

\*Start with these colors and add as you go along

- Poster Board or Cardboard—This is to place your paper on while you paint. Kene buys a poster board at the Dollar store and covers it with contact paper.
- Container for Water
- Paper Towels or Towel
- Blue Masking Tape—This is to attach your paper to the board. Other tape can be used, but just be aware it might stick to the paper.
